This translation is a service of the HMTMH. The German original is the binding description of the entrance examination/audition.

The entrance examination for the Master's programme Artistic-Pedagogical Education M.Mus. takes place as a live entrance examination at the university.

Requirements for the entrance examination

Live entrance examination

First part of the examination (approx. 30 min.)

- Conducting (accompanist on the piano)
 - Johann Sebastian Bach: Motet "Jesu, meine Freude" BWV 227, from it: "Trotz dem alten Drachen" (In spite of the old dragon)
 - Joseph Haydn: "Die Schöpfung" (The Creation), overture and first recitative to "von der Finsternis" (from darkness)
 - <u>Singing</u>: Performance of two freely chosen works of different periods with or without accompaniment (singing and playing the piano at the same time is not advised).
 - <u>Piano</u>: Performance of two works from different periods (advanced level). If piano is not the main instrument, the performance of an additional piece on the main instrument is also possible.
- Sightreading piano reductions: e.g. Mendelssohn Elijah
- Sightreading scores: vocal music Old and New Clefs, orchestral score
- Singing a sightread choral part as well as playing several voices and singing another voice at the same time (sightreading).
- Ear training (oral): advanced level, recognition of intervals, triads and tetrads and modulation paths.

<u>Second part of the examination (approx. 15 min., only after passing the first part of the examination):</u>

- Rehearsal methodology with a choir: Working on a choral piece announced 2 weeks before the entrance examination.

<u>Third part of the examination</u> (approx. 10-15 min., only after passing the second part of the examination):

- Rehearsal methodology with an instrumental ensemble: Working on an orchestral work: Brahms: Symphony No. 3, 2nd movement

Examination parts 2 and 3 are omitted if ensemble rehearsals are not possible due to external conditions (corona pandemic).

Assessment:

A point system of 1-15 points is being applied (check out the admission regulations on the study programme page <u>Study programmes</u>).
