

The Institute of JazzRockPop of Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media, Germany, invites applications for the following position, which is to be filled as soon as possible:

Junior Professorship for Music Theory/Arrangement/Orchestration

Pay grade W1 NBesO (Lower Saxony Salary Scale) with tenure track leading to pay grade W2 (100%)

The professorship is funded by the Federal Tenure Track Programme.

We are seeking a candidate with the following qualifications:

- A degree in music theory or musicology (PhD is desired)
- International experience
- Excellent artistic and practical aptitude with a focus on jazz, rock and pop and proof of work published based on long-standing experience as an orchestra arranger and orchestrator of popular music
- Good teaching skills
- Experience teaching in universities over several years
- Professional and proficient usage of relevant music sequencer and notation software and orchestra sample libraries in order to demonstrate arrangements

Further requirements the junior professor is required to have are listed in article 30 of Lower Saxony's University Act (NHG).

Some of the junior professor's responsibilities will include teaching students following the jazz and jazz-related bachelor courses, as well as the JRP master in music as a performing artist, the popular music bachelor and the interdisciplinary bachelor majoring in music (which also qualifies students to teach in German schools) with a focus on jazz, rock and pop, as well as organizational and academic management tasks.

If the conditions of employment are met, the junior professor will initially receive a contract for three years and temporary civil servant status. Should the candidate pass the evaluation specified in article 30 para 4 sentence 2 of the NHG and the tenure track procedure, specified in the Regulations for Granting a Tenured Professorship at Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media, a tenured professorship attracting pay grade W2 NBesO will be awarded, without the post being otherwise advertised, as long as the other statutory requirements are met.

Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media is striving to increase the number of female artistic and academic staff and strongly encourages women to apply. Where candidates' qualifications are identical, women will be given preference to the extent permitted by law. The same applies to people with special needs.
